Tips for Staying Healthy Novel Influenza A (H1N1)

With the fall semester and flu season upon us, now is the time to start implementing good hygiene routines, if you haven't done so already.

Prevention

Germs can be spread when a person touches respiratory droplets on a surface like a desk then touches their eyes, mouth or nose. The influenza virus can survive on environmental surfaces, and infect a person, for 2 to 8 hours after being deposited on a surface. Wash your hands often and avoid touching your eyes, mouth or nose.

Warning Signs in Children

If children become ill and experience fast breathing or trouble breathing, bluish or gray skin color, not drinking enough fluids, severe or persistent vomiting, not waking up or not interacting, being so irritable the child does not want to be held, flu-like symptoms that improve only to return with fever and worse cough, then seek urgent medical attention.

Caring for Someone with the Flu

- * Tissues and other disposable items should be thrown in the trash.
- * Keep surfaces clean (bedside tables, bathrooms, kitchen counters, toys) by wiping with a household disinfectant.
- * Do not share linens, utensils or dishes.
- * Avoid "hugging" laundry and wash hands after handling.

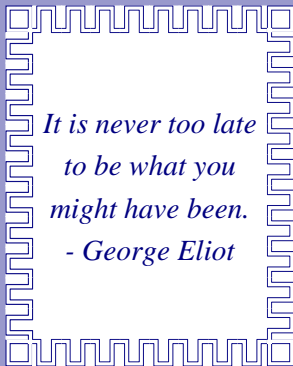
Your Department of Public Safety
