Online Resources: Use these databases to locate articles from magazines, journals, newspapers, reference books and entire ebooks.

- Choose “Online Resources” Note: when accessing from off campus, users will be prompted to enter the 14 digit number, above the barcode on the front of their Mott ID card.

Academic Search Complete - This comprehensive scholarly, multi-disciplinary full-text database, with more than 7,100 full-text periodicals, includes more than 6,100 peer-reviewed journals. The database allows users to limit their searches to full-text documents and peer-reviewed documents.

JSTOR: Full Text Scholarly Journals - JSTOR's search engine allows users to browse and search individual journals, or perform cross-disciplinary searches of multiple journals in multiple disciplines.

Opposing Viewpoints Resource Center – Users can find you'll find a variety of reference materials, commentaries and viewpoints, periodical and news articles, primary sources, statistics and multimedia in *Opposing Viewpoints Resource Center*.

Westlaw Campus Research – This database contains hundreds of newspapers, newswires, magazines, and broadcast transcripts. Much of the information can't easily be found on the Internet or any other readily available sources.

Note: Checking the boxes “Search only the headlines and lead paragraphs” and “Identify duplicate documents” will aid your search.

Library Catalog: The catalog locates books in the Mott College Library and other libraries.

- Choose “Library Catalog” Note: books in the Mott College Library will have the Mott apple tree icon next to the title. You can request books from Baker or Kettering using the “Request Item” link.

MeLCat: MeLCat allows users to locate books in the collections of over 100 Michigan libraries and have the books sent to the Mott College Library.
