- 1. Students can fulfill NMU's **World Cultures** requirement by completing one of the following while at Mott Community College: ANTH 211, GEOG 142, HIST 112, HIST 113, MUS 183, or PHIL 251
- 2. At least one course in the Liberal Studies Program must be at the **300-level or above**. This requirement can be completed before attending the university if the transfer student selects a course that transfers at that level. At Mott Community College, the following courses meet this requirement: ART 215, ENGL 220, ENGL 231, or MUS 183

Note: A maximum of 64 semester credits and an additional 4 semester credits in physical education activity courses may transfer from a two-year community or junior college.
