Memorandum from Amy Fugate, Vice President for Academic Affairs regarding Late-Start Classes	Received for Information	During the Winter schedule building process, the Academic Deans brought to my attention that the Fall2 and Winter2 offerings have been experiencing declining enrollments to the point where they had chosen not to offer courses in the sessions for Winter 2008. Instead, it was suggested that a variation of the session be offered that would have classes begin on the same day as the Winter2 session, but extend to the end of the 15 week Winter semester. It was rationalized that the offering would provide students who register late or who may drop a class during add/drop, a set of offerings to choose from that would maximize instructional time while increasing a student's chance of success.  Given this, I approved piloting the Late Start Winter semester that began February 11, 2008 and will run through May 2, 2008. This offering has proven viable and I have given approval to move ahead by eliminating the Fall2 and Winter2 sessions and replacing them with Fall Late Start and Winter Late Start. In addition, a Spring/Summer Late Start will be offered beginning May 19, running through August 21, the end of the Summer session.
