Barbara Kincaid

Roy and Dale Evans, Icons of the Golden West

Friday, September 21, 2018 -- 10:00am

Barbara Kincaid is an accredited Fashion Historian and Museum Curator who lived in Oak Hill, California for many years, and currently resides in Linden, MI. While living in California, Barbara was the costumer for several movies. In this presentation, she will take you behind the silver screen of two movies – “King of the Cowboys,” starring Roy Rogers, and “Queen of the West,” starring Dale Evans. Soon after “Queen of the West” was a “wrap,” Barbara was a guest on Dale’s television show, “A Date With Dale.” Interestingly, Barbara became good friends with Roy and Dale. They both lived near the Kincaid’s in Apple Valley, CA where Roy’s famous Western Museum is housed. Barbara spoke at Dale’s church for a Mother’s Day program, which later led to Dale and friends having afternoon tea at the Kincaid’s Victorian home in Oak Hills. Barbara’s presentation of these legends includes a clip from the making of the tribute movie and a portion of Barbara’s TV appearance. We look into the lives of Roy and Dale for a nostalgic trip down memory lane at a time where the American Cowboy was king.

Restoration of the Capital Theatre

Jarret M. Haynes, the Executive Director of the Whiting, will tell us all what went into the complete restoration of this Flint gem. He has spearheaded this huge effort located in downtown Flint.

Ric Mixer

The Most Famous Rescues on the Great Lakes

Friday, November 16, 2018 -- 10:00am

This unique lecture features the Coast Guard’s finest moments, including the tragic career of the Michigan built cutter “Escanaba.” This ship was built in Bay City and saved dozens of lives on the lakes before deploying to the North Atlantic for convoy duty during WWII. In the 1943 the “Esky” saved over 130 lives when the Dorchester was torpedoed in June of 1943.

The “Esky” was just off the coast of Greenland when it mysteriously exploded and sank with over 100 lives on board. Only two men survived and Ric will share their amazing story. We will also see the mighty cutter Mackinaw Bridge in 1965. Rick will share eyewitness accounts from shipwreck survivors as well as the German sailor that pulled many of the crew from the water. The Cutter Sundew will also be highlighted for its rescue of the two survivors of the Carl D Bradley, the largest shipwreck in Lake Michigan. We’ll also hear how the Michigan built Hollycock helped in the search, and dive down to see the Hollycock in its salty grave near Fort Lauderdale, FL. From rare footage of a whaleback shipwreck in 1935 to dives on the Cedarville (which is nearly upside down in the Straits) this presentation shouldn’t be missed!

We are all aware of the opioid crisis our country is facing. In an effort to provide you a high quality program on this topic, two speakers have been scheduled. Dr. Chris Flores is the former Vice President of Health Integration for Sacred Heart Rehabilitation and is a current board member of the greater Flint Health Coalition. Chris is currently the Chairman of the Hurley Medical Center Board of Managers. The life story of Kenneth Briggs highlights the difficulties of being born into a home filled with drug and alcohol activity. His life story is a profound journey that inspires people to overcome adversaries and persevere through life’s challenges. He has appeared on the Oprah Winfrey show, Dateline Detroit, and was featured in the Guidepost Magazine. He has found the most meaningful way to share his life story through appearances in high schools, businesses, and churches to bring enlightenment on the topic of substance abuse to young and old alike.
